The system has been launched under the Ministry of National Health Services, Regulations & Coordination Islamabad in association with



Federal Directorate of Immunization (FDI), National Database and Registration Authority (NADRA) and Polio Eradication Initiative (PEI). The system will replace the Polio and Yellow Fever vaccine paper based card with the Electronic/Digital Card for the international travelers.



COVID-19 PAEDIATRIC CAMPAIGN READINESS MEETING

FDI organized a National Training on Trainers today on COVID-19 Pediatric vaccination Campaign scheduled from 19th to 24th September. Dr. Muhammad Ahmed Kazi, DG FDI in his opening remarks commended the efforts of EPI Teams from all across Pakistan. Dr. Kazi wished all participants a successful future campaign and ensured all possible technical support in this regard. Later on participants from FDI, PEI, EPI and partners from, Punjab, Sindh and Islamabad conducted a comprehensive TOT involving all aspects of the campaign.

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ORAL CHOLERA VACCINATION CAMPAIGN

EPI Punjab in association with DHA Lahore conducted the 1st phase of Oral Cholera Vaccine (OCV) Campaign on the direction of the Primary & Secondary Healthcare Department in selected 17 HRUCs of Lahore across 9 towns from 10-15 August followed by two days of catch-up on 16-17 August.

The campaign was formally launched jointly by Director General Health Services Punjab, Dr. Haroon Jehangir Khan and WHO WR, Pakistan Dr. Palitha Mahipala in a Public School in UC 70. Present on the occasion were Director Health Services EPI Punjab Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed Awan, EOC Coordinator, Syeda Ramla Ali, UNICEF Health Specialist, Dr. Tahir Manzoor, WHO Head of Office Punjab, Dr. Jamshaid Ahmed, ADCG Lahore, Shahid Kathia, Director CDC, Dr. Shahid Magsi, Director IRMNCH, Dr. Khalil Ahmed, CEO Health Lahore, Dr. Faisal, CEO Education, Parvaiz Ahmed and representatives from government and partner organization.

Oral Cholera Vaccine was administered to all population of one year and above in the selected UCs, were 96% of the set target was achieved.

FPP PLANNING MEETING

Experts from the stipulated programmatic areas, EPI/PEI, vertical programmes i.e. CDC and IRMNCH, WHO, UNICEF, BMGF, Gavi, Acasus, and health education wings gathered on 11th August for a consultative process to finalize Gavi mandated activities for next five years with targets, timelines and resource allocation.





Director General Health Services Dr. Haroon Jehangir Khan chaired the session. He said urban immunization was the next big challenge. He also highlighted vaccine hesitancy as a barrier in vaccine uptake asking communication team to focus on this as foremost priority.

Director Health Services EPI Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed Awan moderated the discussion across all strategic priority areas. He welcomed renewed focus on research, data analysis, data modelling and communication and said in a fast changing world, inter disciplinary and cross cutting approaches were emerging more successful. He emphasized a multi sectoral strategy involving a wide range of stake holders. With time, he added, the program needs to evolve and tailor itself to larger social and technological needs.

All programmatic areas came under discussion with budget allocation. Nearly a 100 indicators with barriers, activity plan and priority points were marked for implementation over the next five years.

PREPARATIONS FOR PEDIATRIC COVID-19 VACCINATION CAMPAIGN IN FIVE DISTRICTS

Punjab rolled off preparations for Pediatric COVID-19 Vaccination Campaign in five districts with provincial TOT on 31st August for the teams of these districts.

Director General Health Services Punjab Dr. Haroon Jehangir Khan was chief guest in the one day event where Master Trainers were imparted training on campaign implementation, supervision, vaccine handling, storage &



transportation, NIMS reporting, R&R tools, Microplanning, AEFI Management, referral and ACSM activities.

The six-day vaccination campaign will be conducted in Bahawalpur, Lahore, Multan, Okara and Rawalpindi. Children of 5 years to less than 12 years of age will be administered first dose of COVID-19 vaccine.

Present on the occasion were Director Health Services EPI Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed Awan, WHO Head of Office Punjab Dr. Jamshaid Ahmed, Additional Director EPI Dr. Samra Khurram, Dr. Abdul Jabbar, Dr. Wasim Ali, UNICEF Representative Dr. Mushtaq Shad, JSI team lead by Dr. Babar, Provincial EPI team, UNICEF team and WHO team including Divisional EPI Officers from these districts.

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WR WHO PAKISTAN MEETS DG HEALTH PUNJAB

The WHO Representative in Pakistan Dr. Palitha Mahipala visited DG Health Office and met Dr. Haroon Jehangir Khan, DGHS with EPI team to discuss issues and challenges as well as way forward for EPI Punjab on 10th August. The DGHS discussed findings of the recent TPVICS survey and the declining immunization coverage in Lahore with special focus on emerging challenges of mega urban cities. DGHS



acknowledged WHO support in key programmatic areas specifically focusing on VPD surveillance, data collection, consolidation, analysis and communication.

WEEKLY TECHNICAL REVIEW MEETINGS

EPI Punjab Team under the provincial top level health department leadership organized weekly Review Meetings respectively on 23rd, 27th and 30th August to discuss and plan various routine immunization and campaign mode programme modalities.





STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING ON COVID-19 PEDIATRIC CAMPAIGN

A Steering Committee meeting headed by Sindh Health Minister honorable Dr. Azra Pechuho, was held on 29th August to discuss upcoming COVID-19 vaccination campaign. It was attended by Secretary Health Zulfiqar Shah, Parliamentary Secretary Health Qasim Siraj Soomro, Programme Director, EPI, Dr Irshad Ahmed Memon and representatives from partner organizations. It was discussed that COVID-19 morbidity and mortality in the 5-11 year cohort had been identified in eight high prevalence districts, monitored from March 2020 to August 2022. Health Minister directed all concerned to gear up for a coordinated COVID-19 Pediatric campaign scheduled from 19th to 24th September, 2022.

QUARTERLY REVIEW MEETING OF THE CHOTI KHUSHI IMMUNIZATION INCENTIVE SUPPORT PROGRAMME

The first Quarterly Review Meeting of EPI Sindh Choti Khushi Immunization Incentive Support Programme was held at EPI Sindh on August 11. The purpose of the session was to showcase the programme implementation status in the 7 low immunization districts of Sindh, discuss feedback and insights from district-level teams and highlight the key next steps. The meeting was chaired by the PD EPI Sindh, Dr. Irshad Ahmed



Memon. Key members in attendance were Senior Advisor Health IRD, Dr. Akram Sultan, Provincial Coordinator, Dr. Vijay Kumar and Site Project Director, Dr. Misbah Munir. The DHOs and ADHOs of District Karachi East, Central and West, Hyderabad, Qamber Shahdadkot, Jacobabad and Sujawal were also present along with the DIOs and DFCs IRD.

The Choti Khushi Immunization Incentive Support Programme aims to improve immunization coverage, timeliness and equity through the provision of small mobile-based conditional cash transfers to caregivers of children under 2 years of age. These small yet effective cash transfers aim to increase immunization coverage across the province, by promoting positive behavioral change for immunizations.

EPI SINDH PAKISTAN'S MOBILE IMMUNIZATION VAN PROGRAMME CONTINUES TO DELIVER


FPI Sindh and IRD Pakistan's Mobile Immunization Van programme is contributing to enhancing immunization activities, immunization more accessible routine underprivileged and nomadic communities. Despite the poor weather conditions and monsoon downpours, the Mobile Vans actively carried out their field activities within outreach collaboration with the Sindh in areas



Government. With 5 Mobile vans currently active, children were immunized along with the internally displaced persons (IDPs) to prevent them from infectious diseases. During the outreach activity, the Mobile Vans identified IDPs and immunized vulnerable children within Seeta Nagar at Government Boy's Primary School, Government Degree College Ghazi Goth, Government Girls Degree College in District East, and in sector 4 Suranjani District West.

Since 2019, Mobile vans have immunized over 55,000 children along with more than 3,500 women, and have administered 200,000 doses of vaccines as of August.

ONE DAY PROVINCIAL TOT FOR FAITH BASED ORGANIZATIONS ORGANIZED

EPI, KP organized one day Provincial Level Training of Trainers on enhancing COVID-19 vaccination gender base equity coverage health through involvement of Faith Based Organizations (FBOs)/Religious Leaders in South KP on 17th August.

FBOs and Religious Leaders from all districts of South KP participated in this activity; while they ensured full support for the creation of awareness among the people of South KP and Merged Districts. The project aims towards Enhancing COVID-19 vaccination gender based equity coverage through capacity building and involvement of Faith Based Organizations (FBOs), Religious Leaders and Female Health Care Workers in 12 districts of South Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The project is being implemented by EPI, KP in association with FDI and financial assistance from US CDC.

GAVI FPP CONSULTATIVE SESSION FOR EPI KP

EPI KP organized brainstorming meeting with participants from EPI KP, FDI, GAVI and all partners to discuss the Full Portfolio Planning Activities for strengthening EPI over coming five years discussed in detail. The session was chaired by Dr. Muhammad Arif, EPI Manager and each one of activity was discussed in detail along with its priority and financial modalities.







SUCCESSFUL COME BACK FROM FLOODS

The Provincial EPI under the leadership of Dr. Akhtar Ali Buledi Project Coordinator, EPI Balochistan rehabilitated the district cold room washed out in Lasbela due to flooding.

Balochistan is in a flood situation and all the districts have flood water due to heavy rain in the country. During the first spell of heavy rain on 25th July two districts, Lasbella and Jhal Magsi suffered badly. The Provincial Coordinator EPI Balochistan Dr. Akthar Buledi immediately took action and the cold chain technical team was deputed with the support of the UNICEF field office to rectify the faults and make possible to functionalization of ILRs for vaccine storage and EPI services in the district.

Mr. Akthar Ali Khoso Provincial EVM Consultant was sent to supervise the rehabilitation services for the cold chain system. During the visit, it was observed that too much water inundates the DHO office and destroyed all the infrastructure of the DHO office including the EPI system and cold chain devices.

The provincial technical team made a functional District Cold Room and repaired 8 ILRs which were also damaged due to heavy rain floods. Thanks to the immediate and timely response of the provincial office the EPI system functionalized within one week of the damage reported.

During the rehabilitation work in Lasbela UNICEF Chief of Field Office Balochistan, Dr. Gerida Berikula also paid a visit to verify the exact condition of the cold room in District Lasbela and appreciated the DHMT for asking timely assistance and the EPI Team for promptly responding to uninterrupted service delivery to children of District Lasbela.

WEEKLY CORE COMMITTEE MEETINGS

EPI Balochistan notified a core team consisted of PC EPI Balochistan, TFP EPI, UNICEF Immunization officer, NPO EPI WHO and representative of ACASUS for the recording and documenting the meeting minutes. 


provincial and district teams as well as provide feedback for improvement.


IMPROVED MONITORING MECHANISM AT DISTRICT LEVEL



HEALTH CHIEF UNICEF VISIT TO DISTRICT GWADAR IMMUNIZATION SERVICES

All the new born children will be immunized with OPV and BCG vaccines at the time of birth to protect them from child tuberculosis and poliomyelitis two major communicable and dangerous diseases. According to Dr. Mubeen, this initiative will bring about positive change in terms of reduction in child mortality and morbidity.
