The training program equipped participants with the requisite skills and knowledge to effectively plan and implement interventions aimed at mitigating the issue of zero-dose communities and subsequently monitor the impact of these interventions.

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EPI PUNJAB WELCOMES DR. MUKHTAR AHMED AS NEW DIRECTOR HEALTH SERVICES EPI

Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed Awan took over as Director Health Services (EPI) Punjab on March 24. This is Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed's second term as DHS EPI as he has rejoined the programme after leaving in the last quarter of year 2022. The provincial team welcomed Dr. Mukhtar hoping more successes for the programme under his leadership. A farewell for outgoing DHS Dr. Aihteshamul Haq was organized as well.



Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed's last term in EPI was marked with a lot of milestones in EPI history as Punjab conducted multiple rounds of COVID-19 vaccination RED campaigns under him including Pediatric Vaccination campaigns. Under his leadership Punjab conducted largest campaign in its Punjab history, the Measles Rubella Catch up campaign 2022. The initiation of Labour Room Birth Vaccination counters and beginning of Evening Shift Vaccination got underway in his term. Punjab also conducted several rounds of capacity building/trainings activities under him, flood response and EOAs under him.

'BIG CATCH UP' BEGINS AS PUNJAB LAUNCHES INTEGRATED OUTREACH ACTIVITY

Punjab is all set to start Integrated Outreach Activity (IOA) in 35 districts of the province to ensure each and every child is vaccinated. The activity is being carried out with the technical and financial support of the WHO. The IOA is aligned with the theme of the World Immunization Week 2023 'the Big Catch up'. Special focus of the activity is on weak Union Councils identified with the support of Synergy Evaluation System developed by PEI-EPI team. The



activity provides the provincial program a catch-up vaccination opportunity to cover Zero dose Children/Communities, Due & Defaulters, ensure COVID-19 Vaccination and administer OPV to still missed children.

The activity will be carried out from April 1 to 30 with the support of WHO in all the districts of the province. Current round is being a conducted in all districts except Lahore. This Round will be completed by 30th April and next round shall begin a couple of months later. The idea is to ensure no child misses his routine vaccination.

This special outreach activity follows an integrated approach where vaccinator visits villages and communities under a defined tour plan for Immunization Service Delivery, Social Mobilizers help in linking services with the community and EPI Supervisors and Managers conduct Supportive Supervision. The LHVs provide vaccination services at Fixed EPI Centers and LHWs support them in Community Mobilization and

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provision of MCH services. Polio staff strengthening monitoring to identify gaps and frontline healthcare workers are ensuring preventive outreach team reach in villages and communities.

EPI PUNJAB REVIEW MEETING WITH WHO DIVISIONAL OFFICERS

The EPI Punjab conducted EPI Technical Review with WHO Divisional EPI Officers at the EPI Committee Room on March 14. NPO WHO Dr. Imran Qureshi led the WHO's provincial and divisional team during technical discussion on WHO's support for Punjab and planned activities for year 2023. The EPI Punjab team comprising Additional Director Dr. Samra Khurram, ADHS Surveillance Dr. Abdul Jabbar, ADHS Dr. Wasim



Ali, MO Dr. Sajid Bashir and partner staff engaged in detailed review of bottlenecks at divisional and district level. The Divisional Officers have played pivotal role in strengthening EPI presence at grassroots level. Punjab has added record number of new EPI centres since they joined ranks. Thorough analysis of due and defaulter children data have given fresh insights on the solutions rendering an impetus the program lacked hitherto.

MONTHLY MEETING OF DSVS/DEOS/ EPI FOCAL PERSONS HELD IN LAHORE

To strengthen the EPI services across the province, EPI Punjab and UNICEF organized a monthly meeting of DSVs/ASVs/EPI Focal Persons on March 17-18. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Abdul Jabbar, ADHS EPI while senior EPI officials including Dr. Waseem Ali, ADHS EPI, Dr. Samra Khurram, graced the occasion along with development partners' personnel including Dr. Mushtaq Ahmed Shad, Urban Health Consultant UNICEF. The



meeting was held in two separate sessions on consequent days. On day-1, the participants from 18 districts of Rawalpindi, Sargodha, Gujranwala, and Faisalabad Divisions attended the proceedings on Mar 17. The participants from 18 other districts of the divisions including Sahiwal, Lahore, Multan, Bahawalpur, and DG Khan attended the second-day sessions on Mar 18.

The key objectives of the monthly meeting were to identify the provincial priorities in terms of service delivery to be focused on an agenda that included discussing routine EPI targets 2023, EMR Compliance, EPI MIS Compliance, Routine EPI Coverage Analysis 2022, and Jan & Feb 2023. VPD Surveillance. Dr. Abdul Jabbar ADHS EPI Punjab briefed the participants regarding the ADP scheme for 2023 to improve urban immunization in megacities of Punjab. He told the participants that the Department of Primary & Secondary

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Health Punjab had PKR 400 million in funding to achieve the goals. He further said that preference would be given to the establishment of 24/7 fixed sites in the megacities of Punjab.

EPI TECHNICAL REVIEW MEETINGS

The EPI Technical Review meetings of the Programme were regularly held on a weekly basis throughout the month of March jointly organized by EPI Punjab and UNICEF. Director Health Services (EPI) Dr. Ahtisham UI Haq along with senior EPI officials including Dr. Abdul Jabbar, ADHS EPI, Dr. Waseem Ali, ADHS EPI, and Dr. Samra Khurram, ADHS EPI monitored the indicators and reviewed the events. The members



of development partners including Dr. Qurat-ul-Ain Ahmed, Immunization Officer UNICEF, Dr. Mushtaq Ahmed Shad, Urban Health Consultant UNICEF, Dr. Imran Qureshi, NPO WHO and Dr. Naeem Majeed TFP, BMGF, and others attended the technical reviews as well.

The emerging issues like Integrated Outreach Activity in the month of April, upcoming World Immunization Week, and the Immunization Plan for mega urban districts remained the main agenda items during this month while several other aspects including service delivery, social & behavioral change activities, and Cold Chain were also discussed in these technical reviews.

EPI ROLLING WORK-PLAN 2023-24 PRESENTED TO DHS EPI PUNJAB

UNICEF-EPI team led by Dr. Mushtaq Ahmed Shad, Urban Health Consultant UNICEF, submitted UNICEF EPI Rolling Work-plan 2023-24 to DHS EPI in an exclusive meeting. The UNICEF team presented a detailed overview of the work plan and discussed several activities in detail. DHS EPI shared his observations and suggested a few amendments as well. Mr. Aqeel Sarfraz, SBC Consultant UNICEF, shared the details of SBC activities proposed in connection with World Immunization Week 2023.

MNTE CAMPAIGN IN SOUTH KP

As per the vision of Director EPI KP, Dr. Muhammad Arif, Maternal and Neonatal Tetanus (MNTe) ought to be put on top of priority list as it has been among the most common life threatening consequences of unclean deliveries and umbilical cord care practices, and are indicators of inequity in access to immunization and other maternal, newborn, and child health services.



To overcome this life threatening disease, EPI Khyber Pakhtunkhwa has launched a special MNTe campaign in South districts of KP from 15-23 March.

The Maternal and Neonatal Tetanus Elimination (MNTe) initiative aims to reduce MNT cases to such low levels that the disease is no longer a major public health problem.

Unlike polio and smallpox, tetanus cannot be eradicated (tetanus spores are present in the environment worldwide), but through immunization of children, mothers, other women of reproductive age (WRA) and promotion of more hygienic deliveries and cord care practices, MNTe can be eliminated.

This special campaign was carried out in D I Khan, Tank, Bannu, Lakki Marwat, Bajaur, North Waziristan and Chitral Upper.





EPI BALOCHISTAN AND IRD SIGNS AN MOU TO PILOT ELECTRONIC IMMUNIZATION REGISTRY IN QUETTA DISTRICT"

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed on March20 between EPI Balochistan and IRD in Quetta, to pilot Electronic Immunization Registry only in Quetta District. The pilot project aims to register children after vaccination under the Electronic Immunization Registry in Quetta District, which will be managed by IRD -Zindagi Mahfooz. The Zindagi Mahfooz software will also be implemented across Balochistan with the



support of Gavi and WHO. Representatives of WHO, UNICEF, and Birth Dose Centers vaccinators participated in the event, where mobile phones were distributed to birth-dose vaccinators.

EPI BALOCHISTAN URGES PARTNERS TO IMPROVE THE PERFORMANCE ON ROUTINE IMMUNIZATION IN QUETTA BLOCK.

On March 15, a meeting was held at the Provincial EPI headquarters in Quetta, Balochistan to discuss the Measles outbreak in the Quetta block. The meeting was attended by all partners of the Quetta block, including PPHI, WHO, UNICEF, and BMGF's active partners at the district level, TVI, and JPHIEGO. Dr. Akhtar Ali Buledi, the Provincial Coordinator for Immunization Balochistan, chaired the meeting and urged all partners to



plan mop-up activities for Measles for the next two days and start vaccination processes from the first day of the coming week in and around all outbreak areas. He also expressed concern over the efficiency of the DHMTs and vaccinators in the field and urged WHO and BMGF to monitor the performance of their partners. He further stated that he is not ready to risk the lives of the children of his nation and will write to the Secretary and Minister of health if the situation continues.

He urged the PRCS team to work on all seven of EPI's components without compromising on the quality-of-service delivery



and to conduct a district analysis in collaboration with the district and provincial teams whenever they start working in a district. The meeting was also attended by Deputy PC-EPI Dr. Amin Amir, Dr. Waheed Lashari, and Dr. Rehmatullah Kakar. PRCS/IRC has offered to work in District Qila Abdullah, Chaman, and Pishin.

WHO SIGNS MOU WITH HEALTH DEPARTMENT BALOCHISTAN TO SUPPORT HEALTHCARE PROJECTS

On March 22, a memorandum of understanding was signed between the Health Department and the World Health Organization (WHO) at the provincial office of EPI Balochistan in Quetta. During the ceremony, various projects were inaugurated, and donations from WHO were handed over to the Health Department. These included a solar system in the EPI program, repairs and renovation to 100 primary health



centers across Balochistan, the Provision of a CT Scan machine to the Turbat Teaching Hospital, and the provision of maternal and child care and birth-related essentials to support the MNCH program. Health Minister Balochistan Syed Ehsan Shah, WHO Pakistan Representative Dr. Palitha Mahiphala and other officials were present at the event. Syed Ehsan Shah expressed gratitude to WHO for their continue assistance, while Dr. Palitha Mahiphala emphasized the organization's responsibility to support the government in improving health services in Balochistan.

Secretary Health Department, Saleh Nasir, DG Health Services Balochistan, Dr. Noor Qazi, Provincial Coordinator EPI Balochistan Dr. Akthar Ali Buledi, Head of Office WHO Balochistan Dr. Asfandyar Sherani and other officials from WHO/UN agencies as well as health department participated in the ceremony.

HUMAN INTEREST STORY

Title: "Revolutionizing Emergency Response in Khuzdar: The Story of the Medical Motorcycle" Contributed by: Shay Abdul Salam Baloch, SBC Consultant /EPI Baluchistan at Quetta

Caption: "In the remote and challenging terrain of Khuzdar, the medical motorcycle designed by Dr. Bashir Baloch has transformed emergency response times, providing quick and effective care to those in need. A true example of service and duty in low-resource settings."

In the challenging terrain of the Khuzdar district, a need for quick and effective emergency response is critical. However, due to the area's remoteness and



difficult road conditions, it was often difficult for medical teams to reach patients in need on time. In immediate rapid healthcare response addressing this challenge Dr. Bashir Baloch, the District Health Officer, came up with an innovative solution to improve emergency response times and ensure routine immunization services to under-reached population.

Dr. Baloch designed a specialized motorcycle carring necessary medicines and vaccines in case of emergencies, disease outbreaks (Measles in particular), and epidemics. The bike was presented to the designated healthcare workers in the presence of Deputy Commissioner Khuzdar, Major Retired Muhammad Ilyas Khibzai, and Health Advisor to CM Balochistan Dr. Shahzad Alam.

The motorcycle's design and capabilities meant that it could navigate the difficult terrain of the area, even during rainy seasons, and quickly reach those in need. It was a great example of service and duty in low-resource settings, and a tremendous advantage for the medical teams also utmost dedication working in the district.

The success of this initiative did not go unnoticed, and the Chief Minister's health advisor pledged to provide more bikes of this type in the district. With improved emergency response times, the people of Khuzdar can rest assured have a medical team dedicated to providing quick and effective care in tough circumstances.







INTEGRATED HEALTH OUTREACH SERVICES IN BALOCHISTAN: A SUCCESS STORY IN REACHING UNDERREACHED POPULATIONS

The Balochistan government has faced challenges in providing essential healthcare services due to difficult terrains, scattered populations, financial constraints, and political unrest. The EPI program played a critical role in reaching unreached and underreached populations. To address these challenges, the EPI Baluchistan, with support from the health directorate, the Director General Health Services Baluchistan, and the UNICEF Balochistan team, initiated an innovative approach called Integrated Health Outreach (IHO). The IHO aimed to provide primary healthcare services, particularly Routine Immunization services, at the doorsteps of people in far-flung areas. The IHO sessions were initiated in 14 priority districts in refugee and host communities and divisional headquarters which extended to 18 Districts by including 4 flood effected Districts. The service providers reached people who normally do not have easy access to, or are less likely to attend, facility services.

The IHO sessions were organized outside health facilities in temporary facilities such as vehicles, tents, schools, religious buildings, or social/town halls. Around 518,217 individuals benefited from UNICEF supported PHC services during 1,559 Integrated Health Outreach sessions in 18 Districts of Balochistan, among them 68,631 Children (Male 33,843 – Female 34,788) received routine Immunization, 13,350 Zero dose children covered for RI, 19,615 women were provided TT vaccination.


The IHO-supported districts contributed to covering 30% of the provincial Immunization target for February 2022 to December 2022. The outreach services contributed to including children in the EPI program and immunized 11663 children for BCG and 14682 for Penta 1, of which 91% were zero-dose and defaulter children.

Lessons learned from the IHO sessions that could be followed by other replicators include assessing community needs, issues, and resources; maximizing outreach through service integration; and considering how to sustain outreach services during the planning process. By providing a package of services, including routine immunizations and other related health services, outside health facilities, health teams can reach community members who might not be willing or able to seek or access health care. The provision of integrated services helped reduce the stigma of some health services, such as family planning or tuberculosis. Parents were more willing to avail of the Routine Immunization services as they were provided with antipyretics to subside the fever caused during the immunization process.

The IHO sessions were successful in Baluchistan due to the passionate and dedicated DHMTs and community health workers who drove outreach efforts. The DHMTs regularly conducted planning meetings on a monthly basis to assess community needs and resources and maximize outreach through service integration. Advocacy meetings were conducted with national, provincial, district, and community

stakeholders to ensure resources were allocated and available and that integrated outreach activities were sustainable.

In conclusion, the IHO approach in Balochistan has proven to be a benchmark activity in routine immunization service provision and other primary healthcare services in selected districts. The success of the IHO sessions can be attributed to assessing community needs, issues, and resources; maximizing outreach through service integration; and considering how to sustain outreach services during the planning process. By providing a package of services outside health facilities, health teams can reach community members who might not be willing or able to seek or access health care. The provision of integrated services has helped reduce the stigma of some health services, such as family planning or tuberculosis, and parents were more willing to avail themselves of the Routine Immunization services.

Minister of Health, Dr.Nisar Ansar Abdali thanked Dr.Palitha Mahipala for the generous support and for enhancing health access in AJK.

- 2 Days Consultative Meeting on March 10-11, on Behavior Change Communication (BCC) organized by UNICEF at Islamabad. Honorable Dr. Abdul Sattar Khan, PPM EPI AJK also participated from AJK and gave a presentation on BCC Strategy.
- WHO PEI Team called on PPM EPI AJK on 31st March and had a meeting on AFP Surveillance. PPM assured them of every cooperation and reiterated that already planned training in May 2023 will surely boost the capacity building of DSCs and added that such training also needs to be arranged for ADs Surveillance.
- On 30th March, department of Planning & Development AJK with the support of UNICEF Scaling up Nutrition (SUN) organized an Awareness walk in City campus of AJK University. Dr. Abdul Sattar Khan participated along with representatives from parallel departments to sensitize youth and community on the importance of nutrition.

- EPI annual review meeting was convened on 1st March in Gilgit under chairmanship of Secretary Health GB. DG Health GB, Directors from Regions, DHOs, DSVs, partner staff and EPI provincial staff attended the three daylong meeting.
- Provincial EPI with the support of WHO conducted Integrated Outreach Activities in all districts of Gilgit Baltistan throughout the month of March. This will provide massive support to the coverage of Routine Immunization in Province.
- Dr. Iqbal Rasool Director EPI GB grace the event with his presence in the training session and appreciate the support of UNICEF and partner organization for their continuous support for routine immunization in GB.
- To ensure effective communication between vaccinator and caregivers, EPI GB and UNCIEF organized Interpersonal Communication Skills training on 30th March for all the vaccinators in province with the support of UNICEF-Pakistan. Around 300 vaccinators have been given training on IPC skills in 12 batches throughout the province.
- EPI GB on 4th March arranged a training session on effective vaccine management with the support of UNICEF in Gilgit Baltistan. The meeting was attended by focal persons from districts for EPI and partner organization staff.

ACTIVITIES AT A GLANCE

- Monthly review meeting of Outreach vaccinators convened at Directorate of Health Services MCI on 10th March.
- Polio NID has been conducted in Islamabad from 13-19 March. Dr. Muhamamd Fayyaz Lodhi, Director General Health Services monitored the campaign being head of department. Dr. Fayyaz directed teams to give a special attention to Zero Dose coverage and still NAs and Refusals.
- EOA is being implemented in Islamabad from 20th March till 3rd April 2023. More than 80% recorded Zero Dose children have been covered during this activity. However a large number of still NAs were approached and vaccinated. Data could not be incorporated at national dashboard.
- Training of UCMOs on Polio Vaccine Management on 20-21 March.



SURVEILLANCE MEETING AND INTEGRATED OUTREACH

A meeting was chaired by Dr. Zaeem Zia, DHO on 6th March in District Health Office Islamabad. Progress regarding Surveillance of Routine Immunization. The Chair directed teams to constitute the Measles task force comprising of DHMT, NSTOPs, WHO-EPI, WHO-PEI, COMNet. It was decided by core team of EPI and PEI that Evening Outreach will be started in Islamabad in order to vaccinate maximum children.



MONTHLY EPI REVIEW MEETING

Monthly EPI review meeting was conducted of vaccinators at RHC Tarlai on 9th March. Opening remarks were given by Dr. Shazia Gul EPI Focal Person. Coverages of vaccinators were discussed and they were directed to achieve the defined UC wise targets.



TRAINING UNICEF INTEGRATED EPI OUTREACH SERVICE DELIVERY

A series of training started in the month of March for all vaccinators, Lady health supervisors and Social Mobilisors for the activity of "Integrated EPI Outreach Service Delivery". Th initiative is being led by Senior Manager, Immunization Dr Yasmine Challoub and team. The presentation of roles and task responsibility was managed by Dr. Muhammad Jaohar Khan, Health Specialist, UNICEF the event was graced by Dr Zaeem Zia,



DHO. The event's importance highlighted of reaching out to the poor children and families to increase coverage on immunization against life threatening diseases. A very productive session all front-line healthcare workers planned the microplanning for implementation in ICT/CDA with success. The aim is to provide sustain services such as vaccinations and nutrition treatment because high number of children suffer a disproportionate burden of child deprivation and die before they reach age 5. UNICEF provides long-term aid against all odds and deliver lifesaving supplies in hard-to-reach areas;

moreover, strengthen protection for children affected by conflict. UNICEF will provide every ounce of support in this activity to protect children, vulnerable women today and in the future. Newborn kits to be distributed immediately after birth delivery of newborns. Also, clean delivery kits are to be utilised to provide relief and assistance in prevalent circumstances to which health facility are not



facilitated with equipment. The labour room is primitive and not accessible. Therefore, clean delivery kits are used for pregnant women on 4th antenatal care visit and for the last neonatal tetanus dose vaccine. In the activity a reporting and recording tool aiming for going green and saving trees advancement has been made with design in digitilisation. A high technology programmed software introduced KoboCollect for conducting operation in the fieldwork. This ensures a coherent checklist for surveillance and monitoring includes a site organisation, session conduction and injection practise, injection safety, AEFI management, Cold chain, Logistics, social mobilisation, number of MUAC, ORS, Paracetamol syrup, other medicines administered to patients. In Islamabad UNICEF is responding to compounding health crises for children in need of support.
